## How to Reach Physics Department at the Campus of the National & Kapodistrian University of Athens

The only mean of transportation that will take you to the gates of the University campus is the bus. You have three options:

[A] From Academias street, downtown – right across from the 'Kostis Palamas' meeting hall - take bus line 608 and get off at the final stop. This is the North Gate of the University campus (as it is indicated at the map below). On your right there should be the Zografou cemetery. As you can see at the map, you must walk up an uphill and on the top of it, turn left. Physics Department is on your right. Head to the main entrance and when you get inside take the stairs (either on the right or the left). Walk up to the second floor and enter the central corridor. At the first crossing turn left. The secretariat room should be on your right. Right across, on your left at the third door it is the Physics department's meeting hall.

[B] From downtown Athens, take the metro (line 3 – blue line) and head to 'Evagelismos' stop. When you get out of the station, you will see many bus stops. This the V.Sofias street. Find the bus stop of 250 bus line. This will take you to the main entrance of the University campus at Oulof Palme. You do not get off at the main entrance. Physics department is far from here. You stay in the bus for 6 stops after you entered the University campus. You get off at the 6<sup>th</sup> one. There should be a cross section, in front of you is the School of Philosophy (Art & Literature) and on your left there should be the Physics department. Head to the main entrance and when you get inside take the stairs (either on the right or the left). Walk up to the second floor and enter the central corridor. At the first crossing turn left. The secretariat room should be on your right. Right across, on your left at the third door it is the Physics department's meeting hall.

[C] From Academias street - right across from the 'Kostis Palamas' meeting hall – take bus lines 220 or 221 and get off at the final stop. This is the third gate of the University campus. Follow the crowd of students, there is only one way you can go. Walk up a small rise. On your right it is the School of Philosophy (Art & Literature). Continue walking by having the School of Philosophy always on your right. In a couple of minutes you should meet a road cross section. Turn right and walk up the uphill. On the top of it, turn left. Physics Department is on your right. Head to the main entrance and when you get inside take the stairs (either on the right or the left). Walk up to the second floor and enter the central corridor. At the first crossing turn left. The secretariat room should be on your right. Right across, on your left at the third door it is the Physics department's meeting hall.


The most efficient way to reach University campus is by [A].

## For those colleagues that will be hosted at the Student's Residence Hall:

Get out of the Student's residence Hall to Ymittos street (former Oulof Palme street). Turn left and walk to the main entrance of the University campus. There you will find two bus stops. One for the bus line 250 and one for the internal bus line TSOKAS. You can use either one to get to the Physics department. You stay in the bus for 6 stops. You get off at the  $6^{th}$  one. There should be a cross section, in front of you is the School of Philosophy and on your left there should be the Physics department. Head to the main entrance and when you get inside take the stairs (either on the right or the left). Walk up to the second floor and enter the central corridor. At the first crossing turn left. The secretariat room should be on your right. Right across, on your left at the third door it is the Physics department's meeting hall.

Please note that for every bus that you are going to use you should obtain bus tickets before you get on the bus. Inside the bus there are automatic machines that will cancel your ticket. If you do not have a ticket or you did not cancel it the minute you get on the bus, there is a severe fine. Bus tickets can be found at kiosks and small stores that sell newspapers etc.

Note also that the only bus that does not require a ticket is the internal line of the University TSOKAS.
